Description

The Church of Saints Giovanni and Reparata is located in **Piazza San Giovanni** in the Romanesque part of the historic center of Lucca and in the immediate vicinity of the current Cathedral of San Martino. During the Napoleonic era it became **the building-custodian** of the archives of the ancient Republic and then was consecrated again in 1828. The current appearance, consisting of the baptistery and the church, is the result of the reconstruction of the twelfth century.

The Monumental and Archaeological Complex of Saints Giovanni and Reparata houses some of the most important testimonies of the history of Lucca, from Roman times to the present day.






Entrance door with 12 cm high external step and 18 cm high internal step to reach the spiral staircase leading to the bell tower







The adjacent **Baptistery**, which has always been connected to the church and enriched with modern furnishings and surviving frescoes, documents an evolution parallel to the church, which ended with the construction of the monumental late-fourteenth-century vault. It is accessible via a ramp with a moderate slope equipped with a curb on both sides



Inside, the excavations of the archaeological area can be visited through a staircase, which preserve the primitive layout of the basilica of the fifth century and the early Christian baptistery

The visit to the archaeological area below can also be visited from above, thanks to metal walkways, which can also be traveled in wheelchairs, and reveals the structures of the ancient city cathedral, formerly named **Santa Reparata**.









In the archaeological area, a stratification of five levels has been recovered that correspond to the five main phases of the history of Lucca, the foundation of the Roman "municipium" of the first century BC until the late empire, when the area became the seat of the first Cathedral, the remains of which are located below the excavations of the basilica. The most interesting finds are: a fragment of the flooring of a Roman domus of the first century BC, remains of baths of the I-II century AD, burials of the Lombard era
